Sackville businesses

We continue to work with local businesses to set up a Sackville Traders' Association – in our personal capacities – to help them try to secure extra funding as they continue to contend with the challenging economic environment.

Committees

We both attended the Climate, Nature and Environment (CNE) committee meeting on Wednesday 12 July. Cllr Baldry is the new Chair, with Cllr Gibson in the Vice-Chair role.

The committee has an exciting programme of work ahead for the coming year – including a "Grot-Busting" programme to clean up the town, developing the Neighbourhood Plan, the Bexhill Domesday Project and engagement with Southern Water – as well as working to monitor and improve the standard of verge cutting throughout Bexhill and the oversight of the council's only statutory responsibility, Bexhill's allotments.

Both councillors are members of the accessibility working group, that also comes under the CNE committee. The working group met on Thursday 17 August and is putting together an accessibility map of Bexhill that will contain information on everything from bereavement support and mental health groups, through to foodbank details and accessible transport. The free map will be available shortly.

Representation on external bodies

Cllr Gibson organised a visit to Little Gate Farm on Tuesday 8 August, accompanied by Cllrs Wilson and Jacklin. Little Gate is a farm based in Beckley (with a satellite office in Hastings), which supports adults with learning disabilities and autism into paid employment. We look forward to working with Little Gate more closely in future.

Cllr Gibson has had several meetings with new charity Bexhill Maritime including one with reps from Sutton Place (Monday 21 August) and another with RDC (Monday 4 September).

The charity had its public launch on Friday 25 August. Great news that thanks to the hard work of the trustees and the generosity of Trinity House – the organisation which runs the lighthouses in England and Wales – Bexhill Maritime has secured the Sovereign Light Lantern Tower, an important piece of local maritime history.

They hope – subject to planning permission – to build a maritime centre at the end of East Parade, at the bottom of Galley Hill, encompassing new premises for the Sea Angling Club. The lighthouse will be the focal point of the centre.

Cllr Gibson is the Citizens Advice 1066 town council rep and attended the most recent meeting of the community group forum chaired by CA1066 yesterday (5 September).
