After the debate, the cubs had the opportunity to ask the Mayor and Councillors about what it's like being an elected representative. The Mayor fielded some interesting questions, including how long was the longest meeting so far, how much the town regalia is worth and if he is friendly with the Queen!

Mayor Paul Plim said: "well, I must say I am very impressed with these young people having the courage to debate such an important subject. As chair of the council and of this debate, I only hope I can keep up with the thrust of the arguments placed before me.

It just goes to show that the young of Bexhill have not only the local community in mind but can see the bigger global picture.

I will ensure that should the motion be carried; I will present the view agreed on to the Full Council for ratification.

It is vitally important that we let the youth speak on such matters as it is they that are going to be effected for longer than any of us adults."

It also goes to show just how concerned 9th Bexhill Cub Scouts are about such matters. This kind of debate should be encouraged and as a Town Council I am sure that we would support any other youth organisation in debating any other issues they wish within the

chamber. Any interested groups should contact the Town Clerk to discuss such opportunities. We are here to listen to our young people."

Cub Scout Leader Joanna Ansermoz said "We all had such an enjoyable evening and ticked off quite a few of stages towards our badge work by taking part in this debate. We'd like to thank the town council for teaching us about local decision making and inspiring future councillors."
