



WHAT IS A TOWN COUNCIL?

- A Town Council is the most localised tier of local government and is a properly constituted statutory authority.
- The powers, duties, and the way a Town Council operates is laid out in local government statute and regulations.
- Town Councillors are elected every four years and are not paid to perform their duties. Bexhill councillors were elected in 2021 and to align with the current electoral schedule they are due for election again in 2023 and then every four years after that.
- Town Councillors have no powers to act alone. The decisions of a council are either made by the corporate body at a legally constituted meeting or delegated to an officer, who is not a council member but an employee of the council (e.g., town clerk).
- Bexhill-on-Sea Town Council is made up of 18 elected members and meets once a month to discuss operations and local issues. Councillors serve on a range of smaller committees which meet regularly to discuss issues in more detail and report back to the full council for final decision making.
- 'The Big Survey 2021' was instigated to canvass opinions on how the public would like to see the Town Council develop, what issues need addressing and to help form the future strategy of the Town Council.

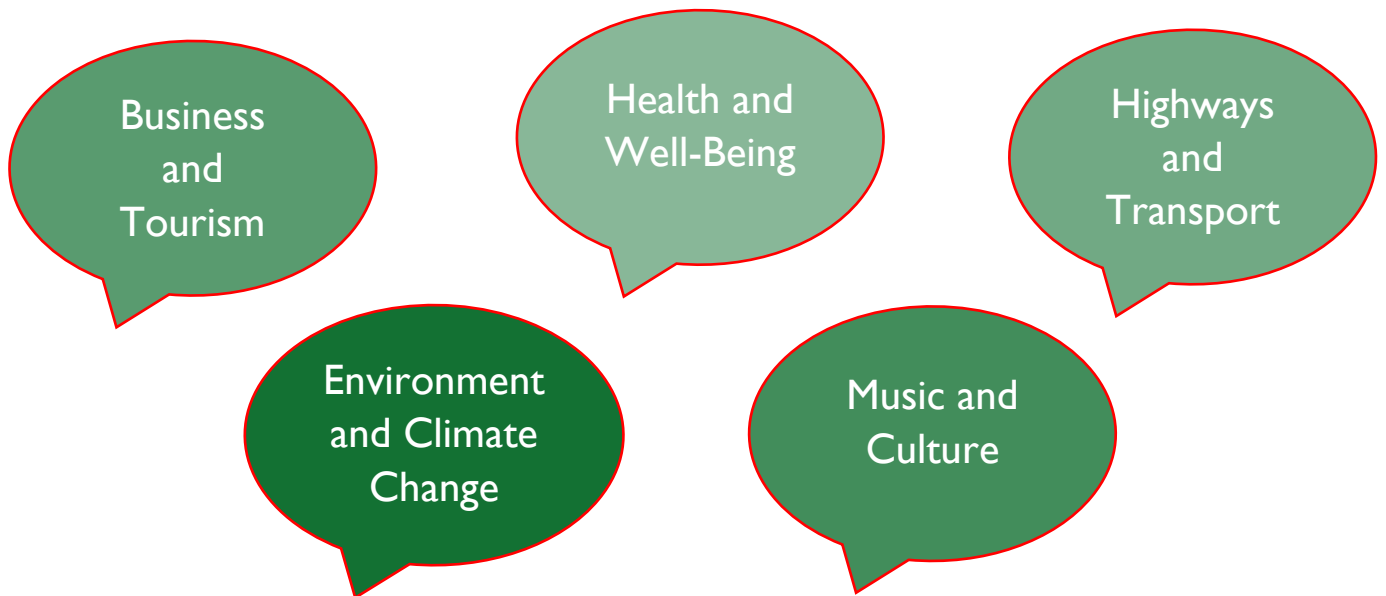


THE BIG SURVEY 2021

RESULTS

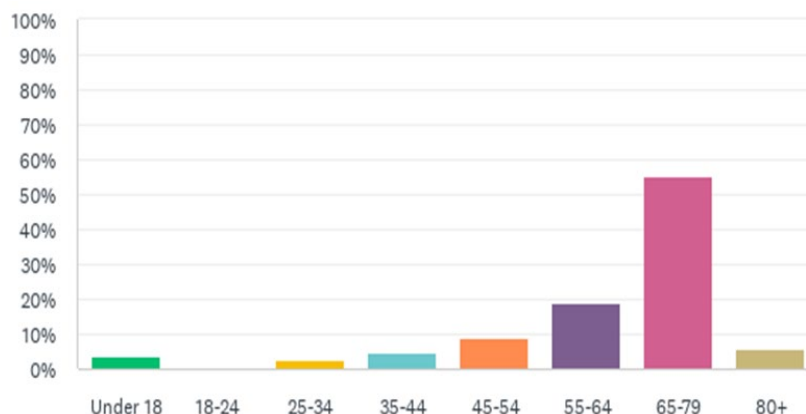
This survey was the first test of community opinion in Bexhill since the formation of the Town Council in May 2021

2089 people responded to questions around the following categories:

Respondents were asked to prioritise the following:

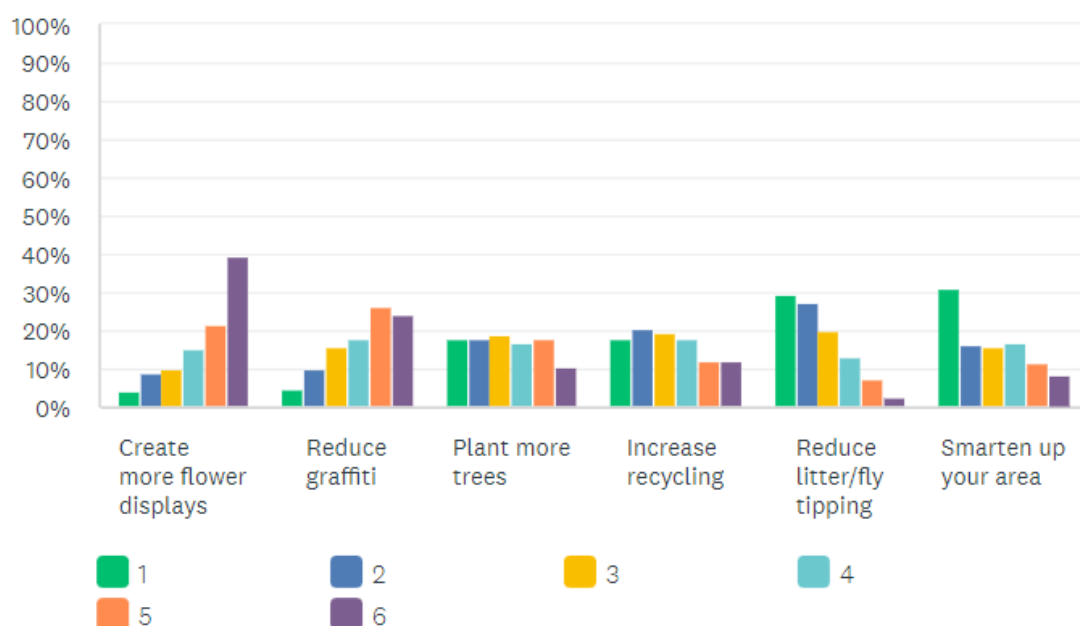
- ✓ Smartening up your area
- ✓ Increase recycling
- ✓ Plant more trees
- ✓ Reduce litter/fly-tipping
- ✓ Reduce graffiti
- ✓ More floral displays

Highest priorities

- Residents felt that smartening up the area (**31%**) and fly-tipping (**29.49%**) were the biggest priorities.
- These concerns were increased to **63%** and **77%** respectively when appearing in the top 3 priorities for each resident
- Third place was shared fairly equally between increased recycling and planting more trees. Approximately **18%** of residents put these as a primary concern while **54%** (plant more trees) and **57%** (increase recycling) of respondents placed these in the top three.

Creating a floral display was deemed the least important issue by residents with **39.67%** placing it last.

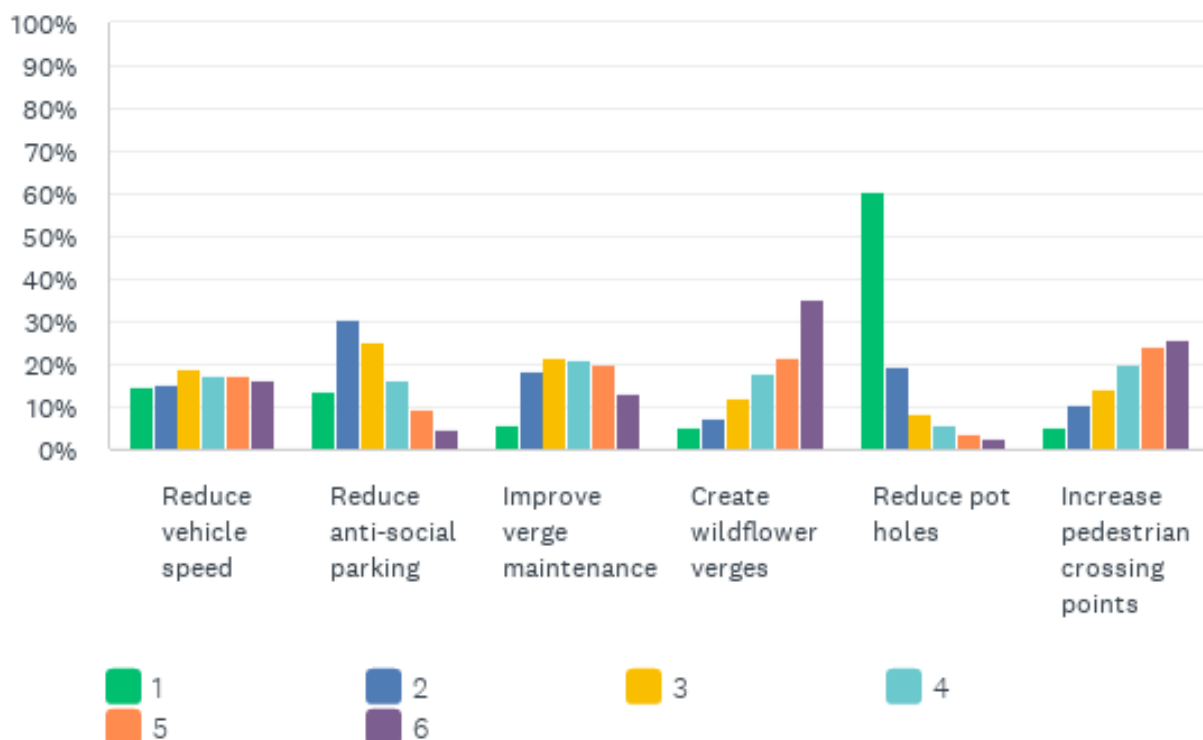

Highest priorities

- The highest priority highlighted by residents, was to reduce potholes. More than half (**60.58%**) rated this highest. This percentage increased to **88.57%** when the first three ratings are considered.
- Reducing anti-social parking (**13.81%**) and reducing vehicle speed (**14.55%**) were rated second and third. They appeared in the top three of respondents **69%** and **49.03%** of the time respectively.
- Planting wildflower verges was the least popular option. This has been selected **5.47%** of the time and appears in the top three only **25.33%** of the time

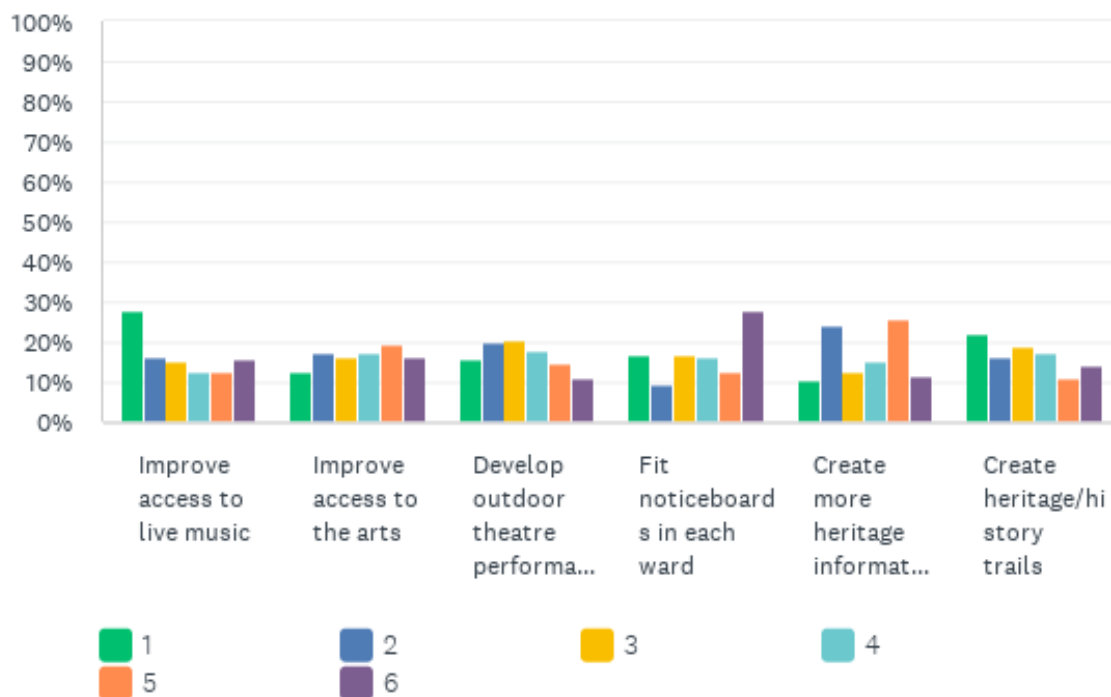

Highest priorities

- Cultural priorities for our residents were very evenly spread with only a **16%** range in the top three of all respondents
- Improving access to music was the top answer **27.72%** of the time, building to **59.2%** as a top three answer.
- Creating heritage/history trails (**22.03%**) followed by developing outdoor theatre performances (**15.81%**) were the second and third options. They appeared in the top three of respondents **57.12%** and **56.33%** of the time respectively.
- Noticeboards in each ward started well at **16.85%** but dropped to the lowest score (**43.22%**) in the top three of our residents' desires.

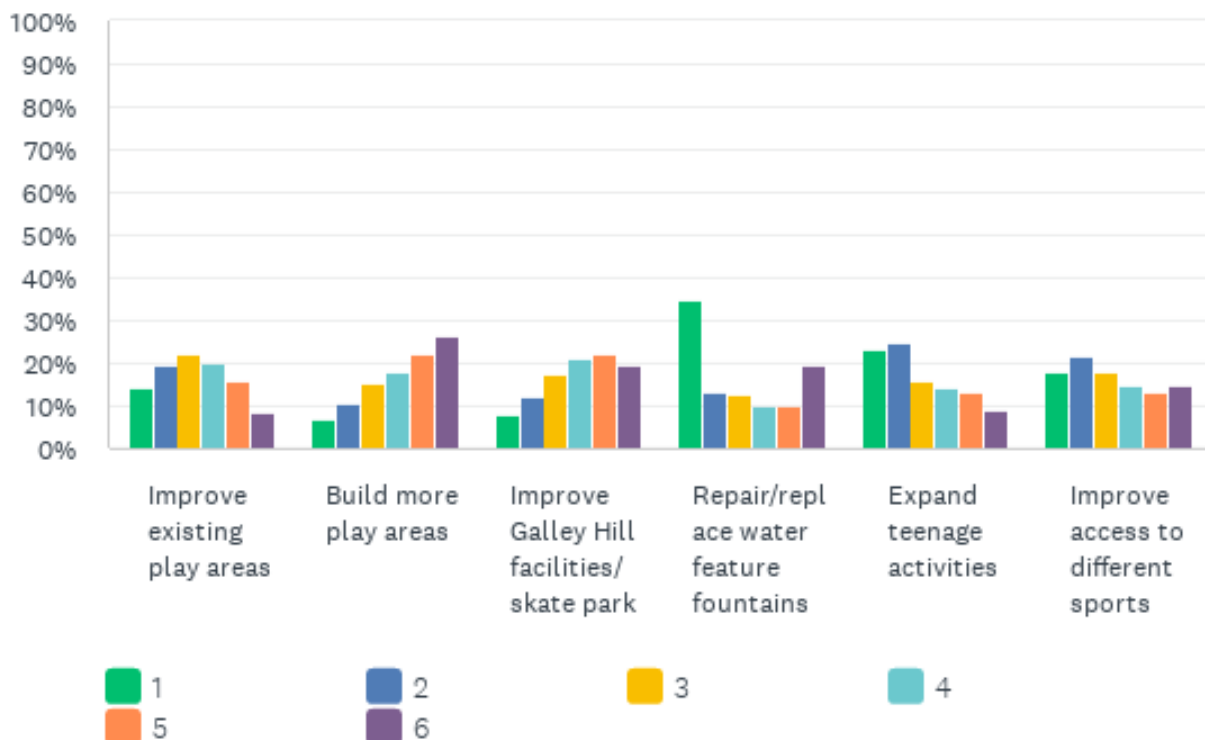

Highest priorities

- Expand teenage activities and repair/replace the water feature were the highest priorities for our respondents. **23.35%** and **34.76%** of residents put these as their first choices respectively building to **63.48%** and **60.83%** in the top three answers.
- Improving access to different sports was the third top choice at **17.76%**, appearing in the top three **57.13%** of the time. This is very closely followed by improving existing play areas (**14.34%/55.85%**)
- Building more play areas (**7.03%/33.18%**) and improving the Galley Hill facilities (**8.14%/37.79%**) were the least popular options.

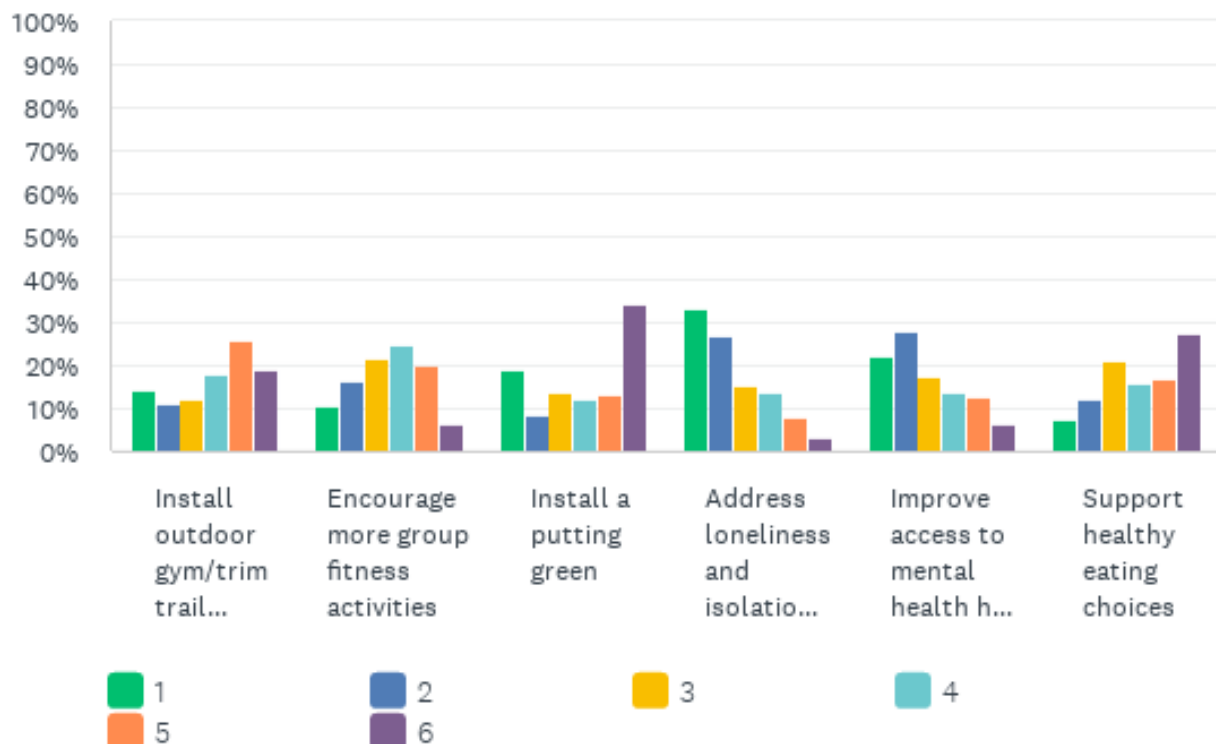

Highest priorities

- Addressing loneliness is the primary concern amongst **33%** of respondents, with a massive **75.23%** putting it in their top three choices.
- Improving access to mental health care was the next highest concern appearing **21.86%** of the time as a first choice and **67.35%** as a top three selection.
- Encouraging more group fitness activities (**10.63%**), though pipped to third place by a new putting green (**18.88%**) and installing an outdoor gym/trim trail (**14.44%**) as a first choice nevertheless came in third when the first three choices were selected (**48.37%, 40.73% and 37.65% respectively**)
- Supporting healthy eating choices was the least favoured option as a first (**7.14%**) choice but moved up to fifth (**40.25%**) when the first three choices were considered.

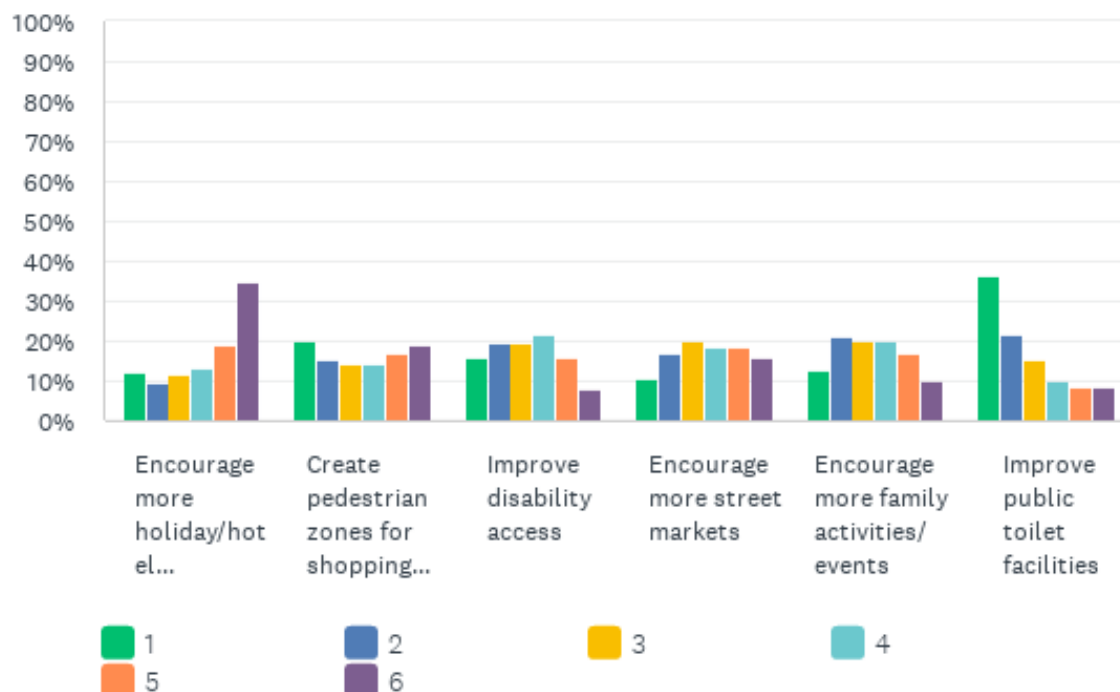

- Improving public toilet facilities was the primary concern amongst **36.09%** of residents, with **73.14%** of respondents putting it in their top three choices.
- In next place, improving disability access was the first choice of **15.61%** of those polled, with **54.74%** putting in the top three.
- Encouraging more family events was selected by **12.54%** of those asked as a priority.
- Encouraging more hotel accommodation was chosen by **12.32%** of respondents as a first choice but fell to the lowest score over the top three selections at **33.26%**.

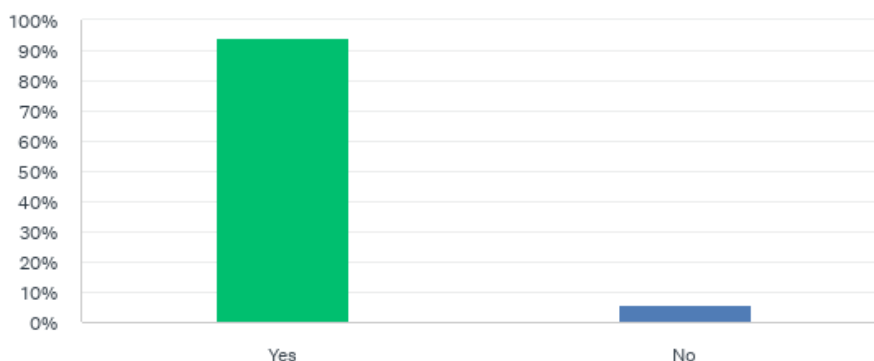

94.16% of those asked were in favour of this.



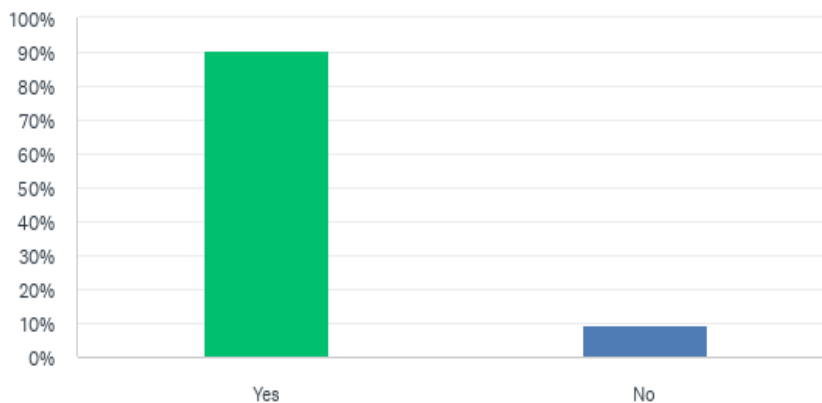
Special Expenses

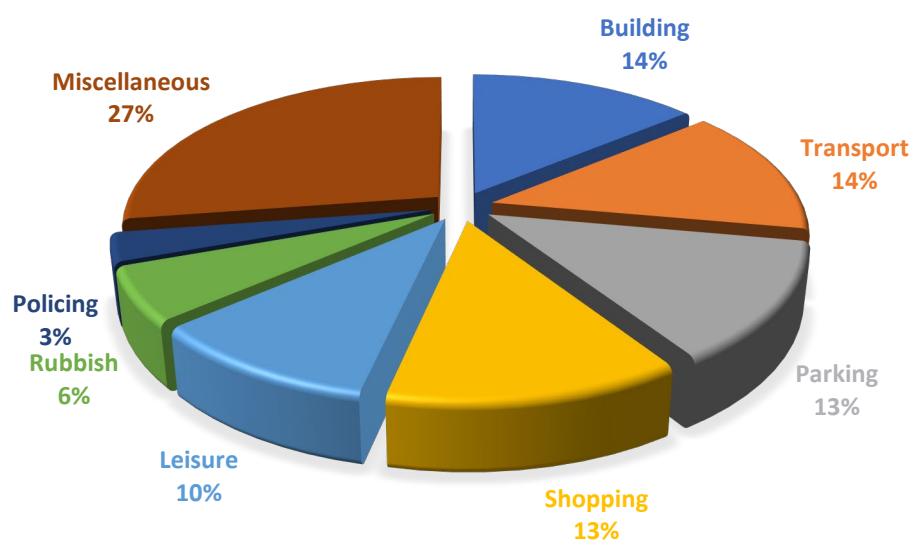

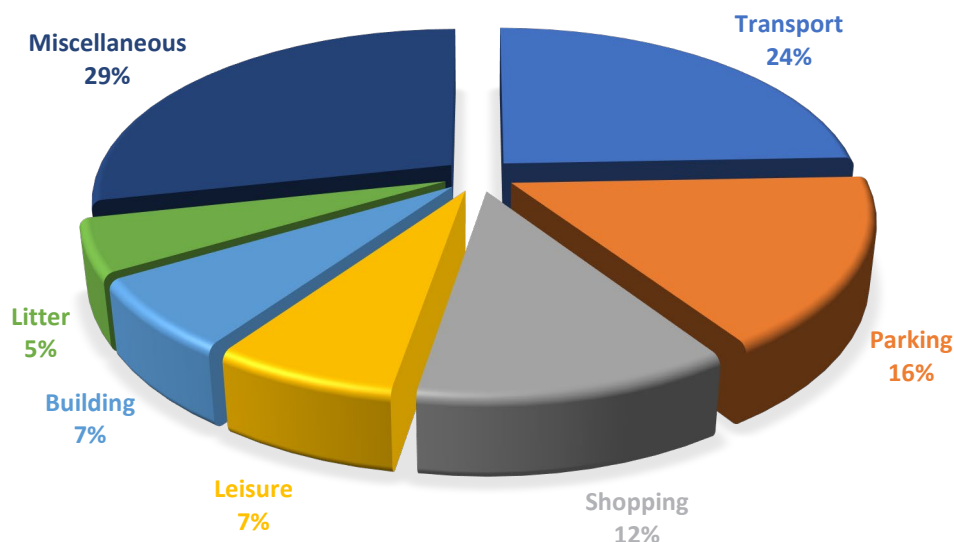
